DETAILED ITINERARY

1 DAY

Arrival at Jakarta Airport



Welcome to Indonesia

On arrival at Jakarta International Airport you will be met by our local representative and you will be transferred to the hotel.

Day is free, for you to explore the city at your own pace.

Jakarta, Indonesia's massive capital, sits on the northwest coast of the island of Java. A historic mix of cultures – Javanese, Malay, Chinese, Arab, Indian and European – has influenced its architecture, language and cuisine. The old town, Kota Tua, is home to Dutch colonial buildings, Glodok (Jakarta's Chinatown) and the old port of Sunda Kelapa, where traditional wooden schooners dock.

2 DAY

Jakarta

Breakfast at the hotel.

Today our tour guide will pick up you around 8:00 am from your hotel centrally located Jakarta. Head to first stop National Museum, The National Museum established in 1778 by Dutch, it was the first and the biggest museum in Southeast Asia in its time, was the reference of all museum lovers. Museum National owns collections of more than 140.000 artefacts. The Collections are, among all, ancient statues, inscriptions, categorized into ethnography, bronze, prehistoric, china, textile, numismatic, historical relic, and precious artefact. Proceed to National Monument, The landmark of Jakarta, also as a symbol of Jakarta. Standing 132-meters in height. Topped by a glittering flame symbolizes the nation's independence. The flame is gilded with 50 kg of gold leaf. The basement of the monument houses an exhibit of 48 dioramas depicting the history Indonesia from Prehistoric times to the present. Visit The Catholic Cathedral Church & Istiqlal Mosque Facing the Catholic Cathedral is Jakarta's principal place of Muslim worship, the modernistic Mesjid Istiqlal, which was constructed under Soekarno and is reputedly the largest mosque in Southeast Asia and the Cathedral church was built in 1891. Continue your day tour to Jakarta Monument Proclamation monument in Jalan Proklamasi, Central Jakarta. The monument was constructed on the site of Indonesian Proclamation (declaration) of Independence in 17 August 1945. The monument featuring the statue of Indonesian first president Soekarno reading the Indonesian Proclamation of Independence with vice president Mohammad Hatta. Visit Art & Antique Markets. Find a very friendly atmosphere here, the artist will gladly unveil the meaning behind their works of paintings, wooden carvings, and other artwork. Traditional and contemporary art performances at the open area are show regularly. Lastly, you will visit Batik Shop. Stop and visit to one of the Batik shop in Jakarta to find the Indonesia fine selection and interesting permanent exhibition of Batik, traditional cloth from Indonesia, in classic and modern designs.

Overnight in Jakarta.

3DAY

Jakarta-Jogjakarta

Breakfast at the hotel. Prepare for check and the driver will pick you up and drop you to the airport for your onward flight to Jogjakarta. Upon arrival at the airport, meeting service and we will take you to visit Borobudur the magnificent Buddhist Temple. Drive back to Jogjakarta and check-in to your hotel

Yogyakarta (often called "Jogja") is a city on the Indonesian island of Java known for its traditional arts and cultural heritage. Its ornate 18th-century royal complex, or kraton, encompasses the still-inhabited Sultan's Palace. Also within the kraton are numerous open-air pavilions that host classical Javanese dance shows and concerts of gamelan music, characterized by gongs, chimes and plucked string instruments.

4DAY

Sultan Palace-Taman Sari Water Castle-Batik & Silver Handicraft-Prambanan Temple (Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner)

After lunch, visit Prambanan Hindu's Temple. Lunch will be serve data local restaurant.

Breakfast at the hotel. Prepare for check and the driver will pick you up and drop you to the airport for your onward flight to Bali. On arrival pick up and transfer to the airport.

Bali is an Indonesian island known for its forested volcanic mountains, iconic rice paddies, beaches and coral reefs. The island is home to religious sites such as cliffside Uluwatu Temple. To the south, the beachside city of Kuta has lively bars, while Seminyak, Sanur and Nusa Dua are popular resort towns. The island is also known for its yoga and meditation retreats.

Be sure to visit some of the lesser known areas in the country and just not stick to Bali and Lombok! Indonesia is really diverse!

Things to see & do:

Relax in Bali – Bali is probably the most famous of Indonesia's islands and for good reason. Although often crowded with travelers, there is no escaping the fact that this place is beautiful. Try some surfing at Bingin Beach or visit the Pura Besakih, the Mother Temple, which is a truly stunning building. Bali is more expensive than the rest of Indonesia. Make sure you see some traditional Balinese dancing in Ubud.

Dive in the Gili Islands – For a true sense of an island paradise, head to the Gili Islands. You won't find any cars on these islands; bike travel or horse and cart are the ways to see all that Gili has to offer. You'll find excellent scuba and snorkel facilities, as well as nightlife, on the party island of Gili Trawangan.

See Komodo dragons – The subject of more nature documentaries than pretty much any other lizard, the Komodo dragon is a force to be reckoned with. They are fierce creatures. Komodo National Park is a UNESCO site and is the only place to see the world's largest lizard in the wild.

Jakarta – Indonesia's capital is a large, bustling city with a population of over 10 million. For a moment of calm, people-watch from one of the cafes overlooking Fatahillah Square in the Old Batavia, the Dutch quarter, where you can take in the historic architecture. In terms of nightlife and eateries, you'll be spoiled for choice in Jakarta.

Watch the sunrise at Bromo-Tengger-Semeru National Park – One of the most popular tourist attractions on Java is Mount Bromo and its National Park. You'll not want to miss out on getting a snap of the smoldering Bromo volcano as it lies surrounded by the almost lunar landscape of the Sea of Sand. If you're there in

mid-August, you'll be just in time to see Upacara Kasodo, the monthly ritual which the Tenggerese take part in. Get up early to catch one of the most memorable sunrises of your life.

Explore Hindi Prambanan – This is the crowning glory of Hindu temples and was built in the 10th century. At 150ft, the main temple is actually taller than Borobudur. This is an architecturally impressive site, so chances are you'll spend more time taking pictures than you will take admiring the ancient statues. Don't forget to put down the camera and enjoy the view with your own eyes.

Amaze yourself in Borobudur – Borobudur is a huge Buddhist temple complex dating from the 9th century, making it older than Cambodia's Angkor Wat. Like Prambanan, Borobudur has also been afforded World Heritage status with UNESCO. I personally love this site. As you walk up to the top, you can see reliefs meant to highlight Buddhist teachings. It is said you can't move on to the top until you discovered the meaning of each relief.

Snorkel or dive in Bunaken – The Bunaken National Marine park is where you'll want to go if diving or snorkeling is your thing. These deep waters offer fantastic visibility and world's most biodiverse marine life. Keep an eye out for tuna, sharks, rays, turtles, and sea snakes.

Have a spa day – When you are in a place like this, it only seems right to treat your body to some probably much needed, deep pampering treatments. Getting a massage is basically a given, but why not do it on a beach. Body wraps, facials, manicures, and pedicures are nice bonus.

Broaden your taste buds – With such a mass amount of islands composing Indonesia, there is a huge number of different cuisines to try. Don't get stuck eating the same thing over and over again. Javanese, Sundanese, Padang, and Balinese food are just a few different preparations.

Visit Yogyakarta – Known as Yogya for short, this city is considered to be the main tourist city of Java. There is an interesting blend of old customs with modern living here and a certain artistic and intellectual presence hangs in the air.

Shop in Denpasar – This is the capital of Bali and essentially the central spot of development and financial growth on the island for the past two decades. It is heavily populated and there are a number of shops to see as well as an arts center and the Museum Negeri Propinsi Bali.

See the orangutans in Sumatra – A mysterious and very human creature, the orangutan finds its habitat on the Indonesian island of Sumatra. A visit to see these primates is a moving experience. And, given the rapid deforestation and fires in the area, you probably want to do this sooner rather than later as these animals are gravely endangered.

Explore village life in Kalibaru – Kalibaru is a small village on the southeastern side of Java. It's quiet, secluded, and a great place to tour a local cacao plantation or one of the many other types of plantations in the area on your way to or from Bali.

Find tranquility in the Bogor Botanical Gardens – 65km outside of hectic Jakarta, lie the Bogor Botanical Gardens. With over 200 acres of land and 15,000 species of plants and trees, the gardens are a lovely spot in which to lose yourself for a couple of hours.
